

You have been in this area for 33 years. What has made you stay?

Carol Sloane, who ran the clinic for many years, hired me and wanted me to work in the main dispensary. Eventually, when Alison Verna retired, it was my responsibility to track instruments and supplies, and make sure that all processes were kept current. Because of my role, management has always wanted me there. I enjoy helping out and seeing the students who see me every day, and love being with my team. We have great communication and get along well.

What is something you look forward to daily in your position, and what are its challenges?

I definitely look forward to interacting with the students, and fortunately I get to do that every day. On the other side, the challenge can be the pressure of making sure they have everything they need to succeed, like filling last-minute orders and providing the correct instruments, as well as making sure their professors and patients are happy with their work. There can be a lot of expectations to manage.

What is one change you would make that would benefit students, staff and faculty?

A new dispensary! I would make it larger. Since they enclosed the space after moving sterilization to the hospital, it can feel very small when it becomes busy. Even though there are only three people working in here at a time, it can feel like a game of bumper cars.

What is your favorite thing about working in the SDM?

I enjoy learning the different techniques of dentistry. My favorite area would have to be prosthodontics. I love seeing the transformation of the patient from beginning to end. I look forward to student and resident updates — seeing their crowns and implants — and encourage them throughout their progress. It is very rewarding.

These patients span all age groups and arrive with various dental and medical ailments, Lloyd said. While the center accepts various insurance carriers, including Medicaid, the dean added that "the majority that come to the school are pri-

vate paying patients."

Patients with "less complicated" needs, including cleanings and some root canals and crowns, can be seen by dental students under the guidance of a licensed dentist and pay about 50% of that of a traditional dentist, Lloyd said. Patients pay around 75% of the cost if seen by residents studying specialties, and about the same as a private dentist if treated by faculty.




