Stony Brook Discover Dental School Course

- Working in Stony Brook's SDM advanced pre-clinical laboratory, participating pre-dental students will gain valuable hands on experience and will discover what the preclinical courses of dental school are truly like.
- With the assistance of faculty and current students, this 5 day course will help to enlighten you and confirm your interest in dentistry and make you a stronger applicant!
 - Make typodont impressions and pour them in stone
 - Use a high speed dental handpiece and other dental instruments
 - Prepare cavity restorations
 - Fill cavity preparations using both amalgam and composite
 - Mill a CAD CAM porcelain restoration with E4D
 - Model a central incisor in wax
 - Meet the dental specialties
 - Have lunch with faculty and current students
 - Meet the Director of Admissions
 - Fee: \$1400 commuter/1900resident
 - Includes Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner (5 days)
 - Course is limited to 60 participants




















Participants by Graduation Year




